

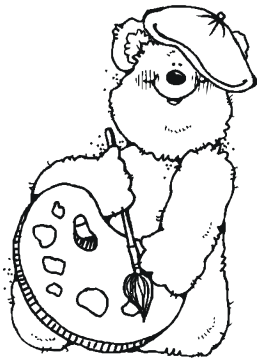

After you finish reading, draw a picture of what the passage makes you see in your imagination. Draw it on this paper in the space below.



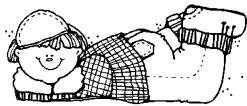
QUESTION - ASK "TEACHER-LIKE" QUESTIONS
